

Dayton Report 2026 June

Monday 6/1/26 TNR male kitten from 409 Kenton

Called to 112 10th ave for a dead alligator in the basement. Took photos. It looks like it has been dead a while. Jimmy Rice from Fish and Wildlife arrived and was going to take the body with him. The tenant that lived there got evicted about a month ago. His name was Mark Williams. I gave all this information to Jimmy Rice

Tuesday 6/2/26 Set a trap at 615 Benham for a cat that bit his owner and sent her to the hospital. The shelter said they would not quarantine the cat because it is owned and it needs to be quarantined at home. The owner does not want it around her elderly mother. Did bite report and sent it to the health dept. Unable to catch the cat.

Wednesday 6/3/26 Went to 514 2nd and talked to Todd Campbell about his hairless dog Copper. I took an officer with me. He needs to get the dog to a vet or I'm going to seize the dog and charge him with animal cruelty 2nd degree for failing to provide vet care.

Got a call about a female deer with a severe wound on her chest and stomach. Fish and wildlife said they could put her down. I could not find her, she was hanging around 10th and McKinney at one point.

I was unable to catch the cat from 615 Benham. I did see the cat and it looked healthy. I let the health dept. know I did see it but was unable to catch it.

Thursday 6/4/26 Picked Talia up from the shelter and took back to her owner at 942 Maple.

Friday 6/5/26 A resident Kim Burk had 2 water turtles she needed placed. I found a pond to put them on in Ohio.

Monday 6/8/26 TNR a pregnant cat from 1114 5th.

TNR an in heat cat from 934 Walnut.

TNR a post partum cat from 310 5th.

Tuesday 6/9/26 the 2 shepherd pups were running at large on Walnut again. Finder took them back to the owner. The owner said she didn't want them. I messaged the owner and told her there is a surrender process and she will get cited next time they are loose.

Wednesday 6/10/26 Met the health dept. at 615 Benham for the cat bite. The brother was able to get the cat in a cage. They released him from quarantine and Forever homes cat adoption took him. CCAS refused to take him.

There were 2 dogs running at Velo. One jumped on the golf cart and had a microchip the other ran away. I was able to return the dog home at 1116 4th.

Thursday 6/11/26 the shelter got an email about sick kittens at 206 3rd. That address is empty. The kittens are living under the deck and have eyes matted shut and diarrhea. One kitten has already died and its body is under the deck. Will try to catch the kittens and get them vet care.

The 2 shepherd pups were at 934 Walnut again. I called an officer to cite the owner at 942 Maple but she was not home. I got in contact with her and she is out of town and her daughter is at work. The shelter did not want to accept the dogs because they felt they would be abandoned. I was able to get in touch with a realtor that was taking pictures of the house and put the dogs inside.

Got a complaint about a baby deer crying behind 426 8th in the lot. I could not locate.

Got an email about a mailman complaining about an aggressive dog at 127 4th. Spoke to the owner and advised.

Called about a microbully at 617 8th. I put the dog in the van and waited in the area while I did paperwork and someone came out of 627 8th and said it was their daughters dog.

Friday 6/12/26 Picked up 4 kittens from 206 3rd. 3 kittens are very sick and one looks fairly healthy and bigger than the others. Kittens went to Petwow for exam and meds.

Notice to 401 10th about a Husky being left outside all day. The owners called back and said their dog goes out a few times a day to go to the bathroom but the dog that is out all day is at 923 Ervin Terrace. 923 Ervin Terrace said the problem was 401 10th. Will monitor area.

Monday 6/15/26 TNR male cat from 231 3rd.

TNR pregnant cat from 409 Kenton.

Picked up 2 more sick kittens from 206 3rd. took to ccas for treatment

Picked up a male white bull terrier from 418 Kenton. Dog was returned to the owner at 304 5th.

Tuesday 6/16/26 TNR male cat from 610 3rd.

Monday 6/22/26 TNR female cat from 1013 6th.

TNR in heat female cat from 319 9th.

TNR in heat female cat from 517 5th.

Tuesday 6/23/26 Picked up 8 baby opossums from public works. Mom had been hit by a car and the babies were unattaching from the pouch. Found a rehab in London ky. Got a transport to take them down.

Got a call from Dayton police about a suicide at 500 Dayton pike and no next of kin. He had 2 indoor cats we need to catch.

Wednesday 6/24/26 picked up a sickly kitten from 201 Clay apt D1, the kitten was found in the alley in a groundhog hole. Found a rescue and foster for the kitten.

Thursday 6/25/26 Picked up 8 kittens from 10 Sargent and transported to the League for animal welfare.

Friday 6/26/26 Amber Roberts called the community cat Romeo had been killed by a car. She paid to have him cremated at Faithful friends and got his ashes returned.

Velo called with 3 dogs running loose on their property. Dogs belonged to Dion on 4th street. He was able to get the dogs back under control.

Monday 6/29/26 posted an impound notice for Kenton county at 256 Manhattan blvd #417

Tuesday 6/30/26 got a call from dispatch about 4 chihuahuas living in a silver van in a fenced in yard at 210 4th. Spoke to Susan Newman. The dogs were in the yard when I arrived. Due to the heat she can not leave the dogs in the van. She said her mom won't let her bring them in the house because they are not housebroken. I told her the yard with shade and plenty of water is better than leaving them in the van. The AC could go out or the car run out of gas.

Caught black cat Kristin at 500 Dayton pike. Cat was adopted from OAR and returned there.

<u>APPROVED/ONGOING PROJECTS</u>	
6-453 Dayton Riverfront Commons Ph 2 and 3 12' wide concrete bicycle/pedestrian trail and conduit for future lighting from Berry Street to Fourth Avenue. [Designer is KZF]	All work is complete except we need protective railing on the river side of the path for at least 300-400 feet. PRIME to send us railing and landscaping buffer options to consider.
6-3228 Dayton Pike Sidewalk Connector (Ph 2) New 1500' of 5' sidewalk along west side of Dayton Pike	We only have a few consent and release forms left to be signed. Final plans from PRIME were submitted to KYTC on 6.25.26. Once KYTC approves the plan, we can put it out to bid for construction.
Ramp from Berry Street to Riverfront Commons River's-Edge Trail	Contracts for topographic survey and geotechnical work have been approved. Survey is the frist step and it should be completed within the next month. We will use the survey data to coordinate with APS Geo to determine the most cost efficient way to get an ADA ramp installed.
Upper Riverfront Commons Trail Improvements Improve the existing trail at the top of the earthen levee that runs along the south side of Manhattan Boulevard	The project was awarded grant funding through OKI. Design funds should be authorized sometime after July 1 2026.
7th Street Slide	We are preparing the bid documents to put the retaining wall portion of the project out to bid for construction. We will continue to look for funding opportunities to help with the roadway restoration. LARP is an option. Applications for LARP are due by October 1.
Third/Fourth and Walnut Stormwater Mitigation Project	We are working on the reimbursement request with SD1.
2025 Resurfacing	Eaton and their sub missed a couple of striping areas. Everything else has been completed.
New Public Works Facility	Work/discussion are ongoing.

Dayton Pike Stormwater Mitigation Project	We have pricing from TMS to make the storm improvements. The work is costly and SD1 isn't sure the scope will qualify for their public cost share program because new storm pipe isn't being proposed.
Grant Park	We have a scope and fee from Hendy and are ready to submit to SD1 for the public cost share when the City is ready.

Responses:

We made **177 responses** consisting of **56 fire incidents** and **121 EMS runs**. Year-to-date totals are **295 fire incidents** and **702 EMS runs**, for a combined total of **997 emergency responses**.

Training:

Department personnel trained in:

- Aerial Operations
- Driver Training
- Advancing Hose Lines
- Trauma Care
- Pump Operations
- Airway and Pulmonary Emboli
- Orthopedic Emergencies

Paid staff have accumulated **1,153.5 training hours year-to-date** while continuing to meet and exceed training requirements for fire suppression, EMS, rescue operations, and apparatus operations.

CPR:

No CPR classes were conducted during June.

Inspections:

We conducted **7 inspections** during June. Properties inspected included:

- Velo Riverside
- Velo #4
- Schneider's Sweet Shop
- Kentucky Botanical Company

- 609 McKinney Avenue

Inspections focused on life safety systems, fire code compliance, occupancy requirements, and emergency access considerations.

Events:

- Continued support of emergency operations throughout Bellevue and Dayton.
- Jr Firefighter program started with 3 participants.
- Steve Nuckols received KEMI grant for new structural firefighting gloves and Safety vest.
- Assisted neighboring communities with 4 move-up assignments and mutual aid responses.
- Personnel participated in specialized fire and EMS training programs to maintain operational readiness.
